 found acceptable at the last day, and to be made partaker of the resurrection
 of the just, my body I bequeath to the dust to be buried and disposed of
 according to the direction of my order hereafter named, my goods I
 dispose of as followeth to the intent I give and bequeath unto my sister
 Jane Bayly widow the summe of one hundred pounds of Lawfull
 English money, which I doe vnto me in manner vpon severall bonds
 and bills obligatory, of severall dates provided and never paid
 and my Will is that my said sister Jane Bayly shall permit and
 give, leave vnto my Executor hereafter mentioned to purchase or
 purchase estate in that house where in we formerly lived in Bath, and
 that the right of purchasing shall bee remaine with him or with me
 assigned vnto the said Jane Bayly shall refuse to doe this
 regard shall bee void and of none effect then I give and bequeath
 vnto Edmund Joynt the summe of foure my sister deceased the
 summe of fower score pounds of Lawfull English money, then I give
 and bequeath vnto Susanna Doynt the wife of Richard Doynt the
 younger my said sister Joane Joynt's daughter the summe of fower score
 pounds of Lawfull English money then I give vnto the said Susanna
 Doynt five pounds of Lawfull English money and some from her
 husband vpon bond, then I give and bequeath vnto the poor
 people of the parish of Box aforesaid the summe of five pounds
 of Lawfull English money to be disposed of by the direction of my order
 then I give and bequeath vnto my son vnto Edmund Joynt
 and Eleonora Doynt forty shillings a year besides their wages, the
 rest of my Goods Chattell and whatsoeuer movable and immovable

not given nor bequeathed: my Legacies and Debts discharged and
 hundred all expenses expended: I give and bequeath unto Walter my
 Bushnell my Godson the sonne of William Bushnell my Brother
 whom I nominate my sole Exeutor of this my last Will and
 Testament and I desire my beloved friends M^r Thomas Bulbert
 of Worsham and my beloved brother M^r William Bushnell of Worsham
 aforesaid to be the overseers of this my last will and Testament: and
 for their reward taking herein I give unto him the said Thomas Bulbert
 my little Diamond Ring which was given to me as a Legacy by M^r
 Edward Long of the Moor. Deceased and to my Brother for his reward
 taking I give my silver watch for witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal as to my last will and Testament the
 nineteenth day of February and in the nineteenth year of the
 Raige of King Charles the second Anno Domini one thousand

 of the Church of England one thousand six hundred sixty six
 Thomas Barnesley the son of Compton in the parish and vicarage
 Jurisdiction of Ectonall and County of Stafford Yeoman being of good
 health and of perfect mind and good memory I give the Lord
 for it yet considering the shortness of this present life and the certainty
 of death Do ordaine and make this my last will and Testament in
 manner and forme following: I give first I yield and bequeath my
 soule into the merciful hands of god my Creator. I trust to be saved
 by the merits death and passion of my son and saviour Jesus Christ
 and my body to decent and Christian buriall and as concerning my
 temporall estate I doe devise of as followeth: (vizt) I give and bequeath
 unto my sonne Thomas the Table bord and frame in my dwelling
 house Item I give and bequeath to all my sonnes and Daughters
 and sonnes in Lawe twelve pence a peece to each of them Item I give
 and bequeath to Elizabeth now wife of William Symonds the joynt
 Appoynted whereupon my sonne Walter shall to have Item I give and
 bequeath to all my grandchildren twelve pence a peece to each of
 them Item I give to my sonne Walter forty poundes being for his
 share of all the rest and remainder of my goods chattels and
 Cattle's
