
Historic Buildings Listing of monuments in Box Churchyard



3/45 Church of St Thomas, Gatepiers at east entry to churchyard of Church of St. Thomas. Gatepiers, mid C18, ashlar with channelled rustication, raised gate-stops with scroll terminals. Concave curved caps with ball finials. C20 wooden gates.

3/46 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 6m south of gatepiers, east of church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar with raised rectangular plaque each side, foliate scroll panels each side and foliate scroll decoration over. Baluster corners. Moulded cornice with pulvinated frieze.

3/47 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 10m south of gatepiers, east of church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 rectangular side plaques and fielded piers with central rosette between and to angles. Moulded cornice and pulvinated frieze. Half buried.

3/48 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 13m south of gatepiers, east of church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 lozenge plaques to north side and 2 octagonal south plaques, fielded piers between and to angles with central rosette. Carved west cartouche. Moulded cornice with pulvinated frieze breaking forward over piers.

- 3/49 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 14m south of gatepiers, east of church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, late C18, ashlar with 2 rectangular plaques each side and fluted strips to angles and centre. Moulded cornice with pulvinated frieze breaking forward over piers and covered cornice moulding.
- 3/50 Bowdler Monument in Churchyard About 16 metres south of Gatepiers, South East of Church. Double chest tomb, late C18, ashlar with single oval plaque to each side, fluted angle piers and moulded base and cornice. Inscriptions to T and ES Bowdler, dates indecipherable. The family of the editor of "The Family Shakespeare".
- 3/51 Vezey monument in churchyard about 18m south of gatepiers, south-east of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, early C19, ashlar with 2 incised plaques each side, slightly recessed end plaques. Moulded cornice.
- 3/52 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 20m south of gatepiers, south-east of church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, early C19, ashlar with pennant stone top slab. Plain slab sides with 2 incised plaques each side and one each end.
- 3/53 Bullock monument in churchyard about 9m east of south-east angle of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side and fielded piers with central rosette, shield end south, moulded base and cornice with pulvinated frieze breaking forward over piers. Monument is adjacent to path to Church Cottage.
- 3/54 Little Monument in churchyard about 1.5m south of Bullock monument, east of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, early C19, ashlar with pennant stone top slab. Plain slab sides with incised plaques. Earliest inscription on top slab to J Little (died 1816) and H Little (died 1812). Monument is adjacent to path to Church Cottage.
- 3/55 Shell monument in churchyard about 6m south of Bullock monument south-east of Church. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with 2 plaques each side, rectangular with quadrant curved lower corners, fluted central strip and fielded angle piers. Moulded base and cornice. Monument is adjacent to path to Church Cottage.
- 3/56 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 7m east of chancel south-east angle of church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with 2 recessed fielded south plaques and 2 plain recessed north plaques. Moulded capstone. Half buried.
- 3/57 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 1m west of Little monument, southeast of church of St Thomas. Double chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 shielded plaques to north and south sides, central and flanking Roman Doric columns and moulded base and cornice breaking forward at columns. East and west ends have single shield plaque, flanked by plain strip and outer columns on east end, and by carved cartouches with cherub heads over and outer columns on west end. Centre column on south side is missing.
- 3/58 Goodyer Monument in churchyard about lm east of Mitchell Monument, southeast of Church. Chest tomb, late C18, ashlar with pennant slab top. Plain sides with 2 incised plaques. Earliest decipherable inscription to R Goodyer 1794.

3/59 Weston monument in churchyard about 1.5m east of Mullins monument east of chancel of Church. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with 2 recessed plaques each side and recessed end plaques. Coved capstone. Base not visible. Inscription to H Weston on north side.

3/60 Mitchell monument in churchyard about lm west of Goodyer monument, south-south-east of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, early C19, ashlar with slab top and sides. Sides with 2 plaques, fluted angle strips and reeded centre strip. Top slab inscribed to W Mitchell, died 1812.

3/61 Gisford monument in churchyard about 2m east of north-east angle of vestry, of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 plaques on north side in rococo frames, fielded angle piers with husk drop. Moulded base and cornice with pulvinated frieze. Earliest decipherable inscription to W Gisford died 1771.

3/62 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 1m east of north-east angle of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Double chest tomb, later C18, ashlar. Two oval north side plaques, fielded piers with central patera between and to angles. West and east sides have 2 oval plaques with twined foliage between. Moulded base and capstone.

3/63 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 3m south of Gisford monument, about 1m east of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Double chest tomb, said to be later C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques to each side and plain piers between and to angles. South side has one plaque left unmoulded.

3/64 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 2m east of east window of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side, fielded piers between and to angles, shield plaque each end and moulded base and cornice.

3/65 Mullins monument in churchyard about 1.5m east of chancel of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar, raised on plinth and formerly surrounded by railings. Two arched head plaques each side with fluted Corinthian pilasters between and to angles. Arched head plaque each end. Moulded base and cornice with pulvinated frieze, ridged top stone. North side inscription to G Mullins, died 1796.

3/66 Neat monument in churchyard about 1m south of Mullins monument east of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18 in style, ashlar with 2 arched head plaques each side with enriched piers between and to angles. Fine armorial cartouche at west end. Moulded base and capstone. Earliest inscription to G Neat, died 1814.

3/67 Ford monument in churchyard about 5m south of Neat monument, south-south-east of chancel Church. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with 2 octagonal north plaques and 2 shield south plaques, fluted piers between and to angles. Moulded cornice with pulvinated frieze. Inscription to Deborah Ford north side.

3/68 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 6m south of Neat monument, south-south-east of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with 2 raised shield plaques each side, incised fluting between. Moulded base and cornice.

3/69 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 11m south of Neat monument, south-south-east of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with plaque with egg-and-dart surround. Fielded strips each side and chamfered corners with fruit and flower drop. Moulded base and cornice with pulvinated frieze, breaking forward over north side centre. South side has fielded plaque in egg-and-dart frame and fielded strips each side.

3/70 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 13m south of Neat monument, south-south-east of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, late C18, ashlar with 2 rectangular plaques each side, fluted angle and centre piers. Moulded cornice. One north panel damaged.

3/71 Lee monument in churchyard about lm south of chancel south-east angle of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar raised on plinth, formerly with railings. Two plaques each side, baluster corners, moulded base and cornice. Inscription to James Lee died 1770.

3/72 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 3m south of Lee monument, 4m south of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with large oval plaque each side set in fielded rectangular frame and flanked by fluted strips. Moulded cornice breaking forward at piers and over centre. Shield east end panel.

3/73 Gale monument in churchyard about 8m south of Lee monument, south of chancel of Church. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with 2 recessed panels each side and moulded capstone.

3/74 Bayly Monument in Churchyard About 9 Metres South of Lee Monument, South of Chancel of Church. Double-height chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar. Lower section with raised central fielded plaques to north and south, flanked by fielded strips. Fielded end panels with carved drops to angles. Moulded cornice with pulvinated frieze. Top section with fielded panels each side flanked by foliate scrolls, fielded end panels and moulded capstone, breaking forward over side panels. Inscriptions to members of the Bayly family.

3/75 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 2m west of Lee monument, next chancel south wall of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar, raised on plinth, with 2 shield plaques each side, plaque each end, moulded base and cornice breaking forward over plain piers and centre and angles.

3/76 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 4m south of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side, foliate decoration below shields and foliate piers between and to angles. Shield and plaques. Moulded base and cornice with pulvinated frieze. Monument is about 3m north of Baker monument (qv).

3/77 Baker Monument in Churchyard About 7 Metres South of Chancel of Church. Chest tomb, mid C18, with raised oval south plaque and floral strip each side, 2 rectangular north plaques, fielded corner piers, moulded base and cornice. Shield

plaque to west end. Earliest inscription to J Baker died 1740, on south side.

3/78 Mullins monument in churchyard about lm south of Baker monument, south of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side and plaque each, end, all flanked by Roman Doric columns. Moulded base and cornice breaking forward at columns. Ridged top stone. East end plaque has 3 carved cherub heads. All inscriptions re-cut in C19, earliest date 1733.

George Mullins died 1733, wife Elizabeth died 1766, daughter Susannah (wife of James Phillips) died 1778; James Phillips died 1786; Edward Mullins died 1746 and his wife Lydia; Jane Mullins died 1816; George Mullins died 1842 and his wife Mary died 1844. Edward Mullins, son of George, tenant farmer of Slade Farm and father of George Mullins (1728-1796 on other monument) longtime schoolmaster and parish clerk at Box. Lydia, nee Lovell. George Mullins (1759 - 1842) followed his father as schoolmaster and with his brother and sister ran several academies. Submitted by D Mullins on 21 July 2012

3/79 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 3m south of Baker monument, south of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with oval plaque each side, flanked by rectangular panels. Baluster corners, moulded base and cornice with pulvinated frieze and coved capstone.

3/80 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 3m west-south-west of Lee monument, south of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side, foliate carving below and foliate centre and angle piers. Moulded base and cornice with heavy chamfered capstone.

3/81 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 3m north-north-west of Baker monument, south of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar with 2 sunk panels each side, plain centre pier and end slabs. Massive chamfered capstone. Monument is part obscured by yew tree and half buried.

3/82 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 1m north-west of Baker monument, south of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar with 2 recessed panels each side and recessed end-panels. Moulded capstone. Monument is part obscured by yew tree.

3/83 Seymer monument in churchyard about Im west of Baker monument south of chancel of Church. Chest tomb, early Cl9, ashlar with pennant stone top slab. Two plain incised plaques each side. Top inscription to G Seymer, died 1811.

3/84 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 1m south of Seymer monument, south of chancel of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side, fielded centre and angled piers and moulded cornice. Oval west end plaque, damaged and restored without carving. South side fractured.

3/85 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 2m north-west of Seymer monument, south-east of organ chamber of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 recessed plaques each side, one each end and capstone. Monument is part obscured by yew tree.

3/86 Oriel/Ford monument in churchyard about 3m south of organ chamber of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar with 2 rectangular panels each side and one each end. Moulded base and cornice with pulvinated frieze. North side inscription to J Oriel died 1756 and members of the Ford family from 1695.

3/87 Pinchin monument in churchyard about 4m south of organ chamber of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side, foliate centre pier and fluted angle pilasters. Moulded cornice with pulvinated frieze breaking forward over piers. North side inscription to Esther Pinchin.

3/88 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 5m south of organ chamber of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar with oval north plaque and foliate decoration each side, fielded angle piers and 2 fielded south side plaques with fielded piers to centre and angles. East end cartouche. Moulded cornice.

3/89 Rogers monument in churchyard about 8m south of organ chamber of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side, fielded centre and angle piers and moulded cornice with pulvinated frieze breaking forward over piers. South side inscription to M Rogers died 1760 and W Rogers Sr died 1763.

3/90 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 2m south of south-east angle of aisle of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side, fielded piers to centre and angles and shield end plaques. Moulded cornice. Half buried.

3/91 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 4m south of south-east angle of aisle of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side, foliated piers to centre and angles. Shield end plaques. Moulded cornice, damaged by ivy and frost.

3/92 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 5m south of south-east angle of aisle of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with north side raised centre with framed oval plaque, fielded panels flanking and baluster corners. South side has 2 rectangular plaques and fielded strips. Moulded cornice with pulvinated frieze. Earliest decipherable date 1767.

3/93 Gibbon monument in churchyard about 6m south of south-east angle of south aisle of Church. Chest tomb, late C18 ashlar with 2 south side framed panels, fielded end panels and moulded capstone. North side panel fallen in (January 1985). South side inscription to Mary Gibbon.

3/94 Scrill monument in churchyard about 4m south of south-east buttress of south aisle of Church. Chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side, fluted pilasters to centre and angles and shield end plaques. Moulded base and cornice with pulvinated frieze breaking forward over pilasters. South side plaque to W Scrill died 1754, north side plaques to E Osmond and M Bull.

3/95 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 6m south of south-east buttress of south aisle of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side and shield end plaques, each framed by attached fluted Roman Doric columns. Moulded cornice breaking forward over columns. North side inscription to Mary (?) Day.

3/96 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 3m south of south aisle of Church of St Thomas. Double chest tomb, C18, ashlar with 2 sunk panels each side and moulded capstone. Inscription on east side possibly to Jane West. Two north side plaques dated 1647 and 1673, possibly reset.

3/97 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 2m south of centre of south aisle of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, mid C18, ashlar with 2 shield plaques each side, fielded centre and angle piers and shield west end plaque. Moulded cornice.

3/98 W Bassett monument in churchyard about 2m south of south aisle of centre buttress of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with 2 sunk panels each side, sunk end panels and moulded ridge capstone. Inscription on north side to W Bassett.

3/99 Unidentified monument in churchyard about 5m south of south-west angle of south aisle of Church of St Thomas. Chest tomb, late C18, ashlar slab sides with incised reeding to centre and angles and pennant stone top slab. Earliest date 1790.

3/100 Eyles monument in churchyard about 6m south of south-west angle of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with 2 fielded plaques each side, plain ends, moulded base and cornice with fluted frieze. North side inscription to E Eyles died 1855, west end decipherable date of 1831.

3/101 Unidentifiable monument in churchyard about 7m south of south-west angle of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, mid to later C18 with 2 plaques each side, baluster framing to each plaque and central drapery drop. Fielded end panels. Moulded base and cornice with pulvinated frieze breaking forward over plaques and recessed over centre drop.

3/102 Head monument in churchyard about 3m north of west side of north door of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, early C19, ashlar with battered slab sides and incised frame around inscriptions. Ridged capstone. Inscription to John Head.

3/103 Strong monument in churchyard about 4m north of east side of north door of Church of St. Thomas. Urn memorial, mid Cl9, ashlar. Large ornate carved stone urn on pedestal with moulded base. Inscription to Thomas Strong of Fogleigh, died 1851.

3/104 Pictor monument in churchyard about Im north of Strong monument, north of north door of Church. Chest tomb, mid C19, ashlar with 3 Gothic panels each side separated by buttresses, Gothic end panels, moulded base and ridged top stone over capstone. Inscriptions to members of the **Pictor family**, quarry owners, earliest decipherable date 1857.

3/105 Ramsay monument in churchyard about 3m north of north aisle east buttress of

Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, c1840, ashlar with battered sides and inscriptions in incised frames. Ridged capstone.

3/106 Iddols monument in churchyard about 13m north of north aisle east buttress of Church of St. Thomas. Chest tomb, c1845, ashlar with 2 rectangular plaques each side, fielded centre and angle piers, moulded base and cornice. Ridged top stone. Inscription to J Iddols, died 1844.

3/107 Brown monument in churchyard about 12m north of north-east angle of north-east chapel of Church. Chest tomb, c1830, pennant stone with 2 wreathed oval side plaques, baluster corners, moulded base and ridged capstone. Two rectangular north plaques with plant spray between. Inscriptions to WJ Brown, died 1827 and B Brown died 1826.

3/108 Wiltshire monument in churchyard about 14m north of north-east buttress of tower of Church. Chest tomb, c1825, ashlar with 2 rectangular side plaques, angle pilasters, moulded base and cornice and ridged topstone. Inscription to M Wiltshire died 1824.

3/109 Parker monument in churchyard about 15m north of north-east buttress of tower of Church. Chest tomb, later C18, ashlar with low relief oval side plaque flanked by drapery drops and plant decoration to angle piers. Moulded base and cornice with pulvinated frieze.

3/110 Elliott monument in churchyard about 16m north of north-east buttress of tower of Church. Chest tomb, c1832, ashlar with reeded angle piers sides with horizontal fluting and reversed trapeze-shaped plaque. Moulded base and stepped cap with ridged topstone. Earliest decipherable date 1832.
